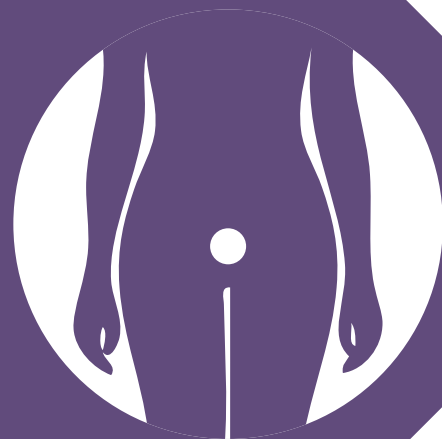


# Cervical cancer

Know your symptoms



**Cancer of the cervix often has no symptoms in its early stages but you should watch out for:**

- Bleeding after sex
- Pain and discomfort during sex
- Bleeding outside of your normal periods
- New bleeding after the menopause

Abnormal bleeding doesn't mean you definitely have cancer, but it should be investigated by your GP
